Job 28:20-21, 23 (NIV) "Where then does wisdom come from? Where does understanding dwell? It is hidden from the eyes of every living thing, concealed even from the birds of the air. God understands the way to it and he alone knows where it dwells."

Even when we think we have obtained a level of wisdom we are easily fooled. We spend many years going to school, pursuing a vocation, and trying to grow in our understanding of life. We don't always know the motives of others -- good or bad.

A minister was walking in front of a row of fine old Victorian homes on a cold day when he spotted a young boy on the front porch of one of the homes. The old-fashioned doorbell was set high in the door, and the little fellow was too short to ring it despite his leaping attempts. Feeling sorry for the youngster, the minister stepped up onto the porch and vigorously rang the bell for him. "And now what, young man?" inquired the minister. "Now," exclaimed the boy, "we run like crazy!"

It is difficult to always know what is right and wrong. We make decisions based on the facts that are present. The writer of Job was saying that Wisdom is to be equated with a respect of the power and authority of God. When we look to Him for guidance in every situation, God will grant to us understanding. Wisdom does not come from education, degrees from a University, or even with old age. Wisdom comes from learning how to let the Lord guide our lives through the realization that He is in control of the winds and the rain, as well as knows what will happen to us in every circumstance that we encounter. Our most important choice in life is to choose to turn away from evil.

The leadership of the Lord's presence comes by learning to trust in His guidance. Not every situation will turn out like it seems. Yet, if we choose to turn away from our evil impulses and desires, God will direct our paths. Like the minister in the above illustration, we will sometimes make a choice that turns out to be wrong. A relationship with God does not always guarantee success in the Christian life, but it is the means to which we can live our lives with effectiveness and meaning. May we each learn how to trust God and obey His commands for our lives.
