James 1:19-20 (NIV) "My dear brothers, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, for man's anger does not bring about the righteous life that God desires."

Dear Church family,

President Franklin D. Roosevelt got tired of smiling that big smile and saying the usual things at all those White House receptions. So, one evening he decided to find out whether anybody was paying attention to what he was saying. As each person came up to him with extended hand, he flashed that big smile and said, "I murdered my grandmother this morning." People would automatically respond with comments such as "How lovely!" or "Just continue with your great work!" Nobody listened to what he was saying, except one foreign diplomat. When the president said, "I murdered my grandmother this morning," the diplomat responded softly, "I'm sure she had it coming to her."

It is important that we become good listeners. Many teachable moments are passed by when we fail to listen as we ought. It is so easy to be so concerned with our own input that we gloss over the input of others. The gift of listening is extremely important in order that we can respect the thoughts of others. The Bible states that we should be quick to listen. In others words, the will of God is often found through the suggestions and conversations with those people that God places in our paths. Those who are not good listeners often do not hear the complete idea that one tries to share. Often we get angry because we have only heard a portion of the desired conversation and have misunderstood the intent.

We should be slow to speak so that we have time to process what we have learned. A righteous life can be obtained when we are willing to take time and listen to the information we receive without responding in anger. Listening skills are acquired through hard work and practice. May we heed the Word of God, and be slow to speak and quick to hear.
