(Luke 19:37-42 NIV) When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen: {38} "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" {39} Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!" {40} "I tell you," he replied, "if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out." {41} As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it {42} and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace--but now it is hidden from your eyes.

I remember using a defense mechanism in my high school years when I was picked on. "It doesn't bother me" I would say, hoping that my tormentors would leave me alone. Too often, we have allowed ourselves to get to the point in life that sin, corruption, and immorality really doesn't bother us. We have put up a wall of acceptance in our minds that will not allow us to see the wickedness of this world as it really is.

We are living in a world that really doesn't know right from wrong anymore. Children are experiencing mixed signals from the adults that make up the rules. We have gotten so used to the darkness, that sins that are thought of as acceptable to society are seen as OK within the church. In the scripture above, Jesus was weeping over Jerusalem. He was the answer to their problems, and He knew that He would be totally rejected. Our Lord always weeps over our sinfulness and depravity since He has offered a more excellent way.

Finding his newly-appointed pastor standing at his study window in the church weeping as he looked over the inner city's tragic conditions, a layman sought to console him: "Don't worry. After you've been here a while, you'll get used to it." Responded the minister, "Yes, I know. That's why I am crying."

It is time that we stand up and look at this world through the eyes of Jesus. If you use a searchlight and look within the depths of your own heart; what do you see?

Have you become used to the dark? Has your acceptance level of evil reached the place of applauding the lesser evil and justifying your response? It is time to do something in our community, our church, our home, our business, and in this world that would let people know that we belong to Jesus, the Light of the World. If the love of Jesus is in us, we will be like the apostles who could not stop glorifying the Lord. The rocks will speak before we could stop our preaching about the love of God. Let me challenge you to be people of light, and stop getting used to the dark. Repent and confess your sins today. They should bother you. Jesus is weeping as a result of them.
