FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Church family,

1 Tim 4:7-8 NIV "Have nothing to do with godless myths and old wives' tales; rather, train yourself to be godly. For physical training is of some value, but godliness has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come."

How much does tradition dictate your life? Isn't it amazing how much we live our lives following meaningless traditions? Years ago you could walk into almost any Baptist Church about twenty minutes past eleven and the ushers would be taking up the offering. Not all traditions are bad, yet they must be linked to some purpose that reinforces truth in order to have an application that is relevant to a given situation.

In preparing for Christmas dinner, a daughter asked her mother why she always chopped the end off the roast before putting it in the pan to cook. Her mother replied, "Because dear, that is how my mother did it." Wanting to know why, she called up her grandmother to find out more information and received the following answer. "I chopped the end off the roast because it wouldn't fit in the pot." A good reason for grandma, yet it had no relevance to the future generations.

Every person has certain traditions that are part of their everyday living. If you visit in the homes of many different families, you will find the practice of myriads of traditions. The most important traditions should be those that increase one's dependence on the Lord for everyday living. Especially at Christmastime, we should be placing a high value on the family traditions that help us to celebrate the Advent of our Lord. Our traditions should not be worldly centered, but centered on our relationship with God. Godliness should be our greatest concern.

Notice that Paul states that physical exercise is only somewhat profitable when compared to living a life of Godliness. I believe that he is contrasting traditions with a real experience with the Lord. Traditions have some value, but a person filled with Godliness has value in everything. What meaningless traditions are you holding on to? Is a vital relationship with the Lord your utmost goal?
