FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Church family,

(2 Tim 1:6-7 NIV) For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. {7} For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline.

One Christmas I had the joy of spending the holidays at my parent's home in Alabama. One of the things I enjoyed the most while I was there was sitting in front of the fireplace. It was really a refreshing change of season from the almost consistent hot weather in Florida. My father would light the fire by placing kindling wood and newspaper between some good-sized oak logs. Actually, once burning, the fire had to be tended to on a consistent basis or it would go out. Paul compares the spiritual life with a fire. He tells Timothy to fan into a flame the gift of God that had been given to him and confirmed by the local church. When we are "on fire" for the Lord and His work there is a boldness that comes from having a powerful relationship with Jesus Christ. People who are aware of God's power available to them do not allow their spiritual flame to die down. Instead, they are constantly exposing themselves to more Bible study, Christian fellowship and ministry. They take advantage of every opportunity to grow deeper in their walk with God.

Also, when a person is on fire for the Lord, they are zealous and bold in sharing the Gospel message with others. Paul states that we should not be ashamed of the Lord and His Word, or care about what other people may think of us. Believers who are on fire for the Lord are consistently aware of the transforming work of God in their lives.

One of the most difficult areas of growth in the Christian life is in the area of self-discipline. Growing in Christ requires a daily examination of our agenda, and a readjustment of our priorities, especially if they do not line up with the teachings of the Word. Involvement in the local church is also a key to being on fire. Usually a piece of wood that is left by itself and not surrounded by other logs will soon die out. The church gives the believer the opportunity to receive strength and encouragement from fellow Christians. It also allows the believer an opportunity to exercise and to be trained in his/her gifts.

When the fire in my parent's fireplace would appear to not be burning, I noticed that if I blew on or fanned the sparks left in the embers (while adding more kindling) it would regain its strength and develop into a beautiful warm and useful fire.

I close with this question: "What is the condition of your spiritual fire?"
