FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Church family,

1 Peter 5:1-4 (NIV) To the elders among you, I appeal as a fellow elder, a witness of Christ's sufferings and one who also will share in the glory to be revealed: Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, serving as overseers--not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not greedy for money, but eager to serve; not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock. And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away

A pastor quit the ministry after 20 years and became a funeral director. When asked why he changed professions he said, "I spent 3 years trying to straighten out John and John's still an alcoholic. I spent 6 months trying to straighten out Susan's marriage and she filed for divorce. Then I spent 2 1/2 years trying to straighten out Bob's drug problem and he's still an addict. Now at the funeral home when I straighten them out -- they stay straight!"

Unfortunately, it is not only ministers who feel this way. Many things that we do to help people seem to bring about very little visible results. People who are involved in ministry must remember that the Word of God tells us that we should be involved in caring for people out of a sense of eagerness to please the Lord. We serve others because God has given us the responsibility to care for those in our church family. It is easy to get discouraged when those entrusted to our care will not follow the leadership of the Holy Spirit and the clear commands of the Word of God.

We must always examine our motives and remember that the Lord does not hold us accountable for the response of others, rather, He holds us accountable to do our best to lead others closer in their walk with the Lord. With all of the demands of the world to be successful, we must remember that the Lord's affirmation is the best award that we could ever receive. May we strive to remain faithful in our calling and let God bring about the changes in the lives of others.
