FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Church family,

It's hard to believe, but the Christmas Season is here! While most kids are counting down the days of the calendar, a lot of folks are not all that excited about this holiday. There are some that are experiencing Christmas blues and can't wait to get past this month of Christmas Trees, parties, gift exchanges and everything that happens during the month of December.

Christmas is a time of expectations. Unfortunately, many of our expectations have become unrealistic because they have been fueled by TV shows and commercials about perfect families and perfect celebrations. For many people, their experience of Christmas is stressful because of loneliness, because of the loss of a spouse, or being single because of divorce or other circumstances. For others, their families live many miles away and it is difficult to make a trip because of work or financial limitations.

At the same time, many parents have the pressure of meeting all the wants that their children have expressed to Santa, and they have mixed feelings about adding to their debt load. Even the Church has added to the pressures of Christmas by expecting participation in every event, and expecting their already overloaded staff to create programs that will often cause burnout and steal the joy of those involved. This is one of the reasons that we cut some of the activities that are high in preparation.

It is so important that we take the time to focus on Jesus during this season. When you look at the season in a new perspective, it allows you to regain your joy during this season of celebration. This new perspective puts Christ first, other people second, and yourself third. When we take time to relieve the suffering of others, it glorifies Jesus. When we do things to demonstrate love to others, it leads us to make a small difference to those who are hurting. Visiting the lonely, meeting the needs of the poor, and caring for those who are grieving, brings you in line with the spirit of Christ, who came to give the gift of salvation to the world.

The true Christmas spirit can be experienced when we see Christmas through the eyes of Jesus. This will keep us from having the Christmas Blues. Let's make this the best Christmas yet as we share the Good News of Salvation!
