On May 15, former Compassion child "Jey Mbiro" joined us and spoke about his personal experience and "story". Jey was raised in one of the largest and poorest slums on the African continent, and Jey's childhood was a difficult one. He grew up in a one-room house with his single mom, three brothers and ten other family members. When she grew ill, Jey's only option was to move to the streets of Nairobi to beg for food and money. At only 9 years of age, he was arrested and imprisoned for stealing.

When he was released, Jey thought he would once again have to move back to the streets — until he was invited into



questioned whether he'd ever have the chance to go to grade school, Jey is now a graduate of Daystar University (Nairobi, Kenya) where he studied youth ministry and now speaks on behalf of Compassion!

What a treat Compassion Sunday was! It was such an honor to have him all the way from Atlanta! If you were here on that Sunday, you heard the powerful testimony of Jey Mbiro! With 4th of July celebratory fireworks and picnics now just happy memories of the past, retail stores are beginning to promote sales for back to school supplies. One marketing professor wrote in a recent article, "Think of all the kids having their summer vacation ruined with thoughts of back to school right after the 4th of July!" And while this may be true of some children, the bargains offered during such sales can mean good news for others. Back to school sales are an excellent opportunity to stock up on school supplies to pack into a shoe box to be donated to Operation Christmas Child. Hurting children around the world who receive a shoe box gift



through Operation Christmas Child, a project of Samaritans Purse, are overjoyed to receive s chool

supplies. For many, these are the only real school supplies they have ever owned. While Samaritans Purse has a vital role in delivering the gift boxes to children, it is the generosity of every person who fills a shoe box with toys, school supplies, and hygiene items that is essential for bringing joy to children. Best of all, each shoe box provides opportunities for local churches to share the Good News of God's greatest gift – His Son, Jesus Christ, with the children and their families. In 2015, Samaritans Purse collected 8,765,637 gift filled boxes in the United States and another 2,447,373 came from other countries.

For a number of years, EG First has had an important role in sharing

God's love through the ministry of Operation Christmas Child by donating gift boxes and by serving

as the only 0 С С Collection Center on the Space Coast. In November 2015 EG First members n d а



attendees donated 427 shoe box gifts. As the Collection Center, our dedicated and hard working EG First volunteers received 15,729 shoe box gifts from OCC Relay Centers and community groups in Brevard and Indian River counties. They packed them into cardboard boxes and loaded them into tractor trailers and sent them on their way to the processing center in Atlanta. Serving as the OCC Collection Center is a major undertaking each year, and God is faithful to provide all that we need to accomplish His purpose. So, while you're taking advantage of the back to school sales and buying items to fill your shoe box gift, be praying to learn if God is calling you to support our Collection Center ministry. Our Operation Christmas Child National Collection Week will run from November 14-21. Here are just a few of the things He may ask you to do:

- Be a one day missionary Monday, November 21 - healthy and strong individuals needed to load heavy cartons onto trailer. If you work during the day consider taking a day's vacation as an offering to the Lord.
- Receive shoe boxes from donors who drop off at EG First, Help plan and serve fellowship meal, Telephone calls, Administration

Plans are almost complete to receive bids on remodeling some of the classrooms in an Energize Room for our children. I am excited that this will allow for a dedicated worship area for our children on Sunday and Wednesday nights. Your Church leadership team approved this remodel a little over a year ago, and we will begin to get bids on the costs for this transformation. If you would like to give toward this project, a fund has been established called Children's Worship Center.

Please keep praying for one another that we may grow strong in our relationships with one another and our relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ. Pray for an outpouring of His Holy Spirit on us so that we can follow his will in all things.
