#### **Traditional Praise Choir and Orchestra Leads in Worship**

Each Sunday our Praise Choir and Orchestra leads in worship at the 9:15 am worship service. The desire of these two ministry groups is to give God, the Father, and our Savior, Jesus Christ the praise of our hearts for who they are and all that is done in our lives through the power of the Holy Spirit. In addition we hope to gather the attention of all who are present to focus on the message from God's word and to open our minds as to what God would like to do in our lives and how God would have us respond to His Word.

None of this would be possible without choir and orchestra participants responding to God's call to give of their time and to use their talent, whether great or small, to serve our Lord as we worship each Sunday.

The Praise Choir meets weekly on Wednesday evenings from 7:30 - 8:30 pm to prepare for each Sunday. During the rehearsal the choir usually focuses on the coming Sunday's selection, but also takes a look at the selections for the next 5 or 6 weeks. Obviously, it is a lot to pack into an hour. In addition each member is provided with a music folder and a CD that has all of the music for the quarter which they can use at home. On Sundays the choir meets at 8:30 am in the choir room for a warm up and quick review of the morning's choir piece. At 8:45 am the choir moves to the auditorium for a final review of the morning's choir selection with the instrumentation that will be used for that particular piece.

The Praise Orchestra meets for rehearsal once a month on a Saturday

morning. In this hour long rehearsal, orchestra and choir selections for the current and approaching month are rehearsed. The orchestra also meets weekly at 8:45 am to review the Sunday morning's congregational selections and to rehearse with the choir the appropriate instrumentation for the choir piece that morning. If the choral piece is not full instrumentation, those who are playing receive their music in advance with a CD.

Has God gifted you with the ability to sing or play an instrument? The Praise Choir and Orchestra is open to high school students through "graduation to glory." These two groups provide a great opportunity to serve the Lord and to connect with others who have a similar talent and interest.

#### Food Pantry Barbara Harpold

Wow! September was a very busy month but God is faithful to provide the needs of His ministry. The Food Pantry received donations of food during the months of July, August and September of \$539.36. During the same period, we received monetary donations of \$8,116.00. During this period, we paid out \$8,019.87 for food purchases. THANK YOU, GOD, AND THANK YOU CHURCH FAMILY for your help in meeting the needs of those in our community that are less fortunate than we are. After paying our Second Harvest Food Bank invoice for September, we will have a balance of \$2,473.97 to start the fourth guarter. During the third quarter, we served 881 clients, gave out 1,044 bags of food and fed 3,028 people. Each bag given out has food for two days.

The Food Pantry Team put in roughly 444 volunteer hours during this time. We have a great team! They are always there when they are needed. We enjoy helping others and we have a great time of fellowship while doing it. We could not do it without Jordan Jinright and Perry Salter who faithfully set up for us each work day. A big shout out to them for their help. As usual, we thank Publix and Panera Bread, who make it possible for us to give extra bread or pastries along with their food.

The Clothes Closet continues to operate on Tuesday mornings at the same time as the Food Pantry. They would appreciate any gently used clothing that you might not have need of anymore. Also, they can always use more volunteers. This may be the ministry for you!

# Student Ministry Looks to Make an IMPACT!

The new student ministry schedule kicked off in August, reserving the last Sunday of each month for local missions. Our desire is

In August, we were able to take a group of about 25 to the Seafarers Ministry on a Sunday afternoon to help clean the center, wash buses and vans, and educate our students on what the Seafarers ministry is all about. Many of our students were amazed at what the ministry accomplished each year and many want to go back on a regular basis.

In September we collected supplies to build homeless ministry kits. Thank you to all who generously gave towards these. The youth were able to build 100 ministry kits. Additionally we were able to put small Bibles

and "Life Books", which are produced by the Gideons, in each kit. Basic living supplies from soap and shampoo, tooth-



brushes and toothpaste to can openers and socks are included in these kits. They will be given out by individuals and our great folks who run the food pantry each Tuesday and Thursday.

For our October project we will be heading up the church Trunk or Treat Outreach on Sunday, October 30 from 6-8 pm. The youth will be working the event, helping pass candy out to all our trunk or treat cars, handing out popcorn, and much more. Even after the hurricane passed, many of our students were working hard in their own neighborhoods for friends, families,

and strangers. We even took a few out and about on Columbus Day to serve and help folks clean up. I believe many of them are catching the vision of what it means to love your neighbor! We look forward to the h o l i d a y s t o



implement some other great ways to reach out and love on our community!

#### **Revival coming to local schools?**

In the 20 years of doing student ministry, I can honestly say I have never seen the impact of revival and Christian influence in schools more than I have this year. A couple of years ago, Dan Carter from First Baptist Church of Melbourne began working as a campus missionary for the Fellowship of Christian Athletes in Brevard County Schools. He has managed to get more local church involvement, training for students leading these clubs, and folks to lead bible studies on a regular basis. At Eau Gallie High School over 150 students have consistently been attending FCA which includes times of fellowship, worship, teaching God's Word and so much more. They worshipped and prepped for "See You at the Pole" (a worldwide prayer effort in which students meet at their flag poles on the last Wednesday of September to pray). This past September a small missions team went on a "Cruise with a Purpose." After finding a very cheap cruise to Nassau and Freeport Bahamas, we contacted Carnival Cruise Lines about bringing donations to



orphanages on both of those islands. Carnival allowed us to bring enough extra suitcases to carry all of the donations given to us by our church family to the Bahamas!

Monday morning we woke up in Freeport. After disembarking in Freeport, we took a taxi to the Grand Bahamas Children's Home with suitcases full of your donations: clothing, diapers, baby food, hand made



quilts and o t h e r items. The workers at the home were very grateful for all of the donations a n d

encouraged by our presence there as well. It was incredible to get to meet them and to hear their stories. We were ecstatic to be able to love on their babies also! Our time in Freeport flew by, and before we knew it we were back on the ship getting ready for the next day.

Tuesday after breakfast we disembarked in Nassau, New Providence, and headed immediately to customs to get the donations cleared to bring them into the country. The customs officials were kind but firm, and helped educate us on the process so we can be more prepared next time! The whole process took about 15 minutes and we were on our way to the Children's Emergency Hostel with more suitcases full of donations!

The staff at the Children's Emergency Hostel was very grateful for our presence there as well as all of your donations. It was so great to see God's hand in orchestrating our visit! They usually don't have little babies at the Hostel, but there just happened to be a baby there who could



benefit from all the diapers and baby food that we brought! God's timing is perfect!

I can't emphasize enough the

impact that our presence had on the staff of both of these homes. They are literally "on an island." To know that people in the US have taken notice of them and want to help is a HUGE encouragement to them. Please pray for the staff of these homes as they are the hands and feet of Jesus to the abandoned, neglected, and abused children of the Bahamas.
